Amerigo Vespucci is best known for his maps and for giving his name to the New World - the Americas.



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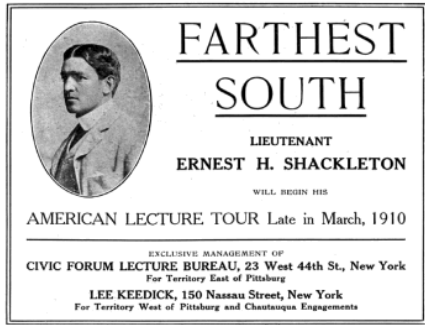
Juan Ponce de Leon

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Ernest Shackleton



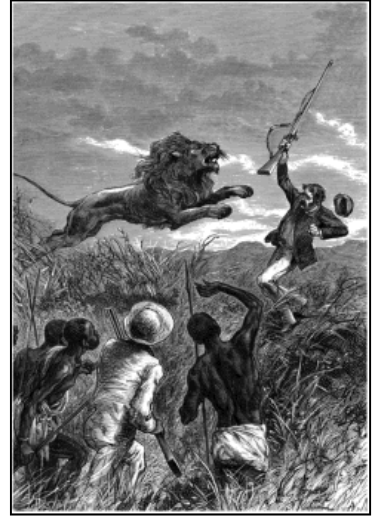
Ernest Shackleton was the British explorer who led the "Endurance" expedition that got stuck in Antarctica.

Meriwether Lewis and William Clark led the first expedition across America to the Pacific Northwest of the U.S.

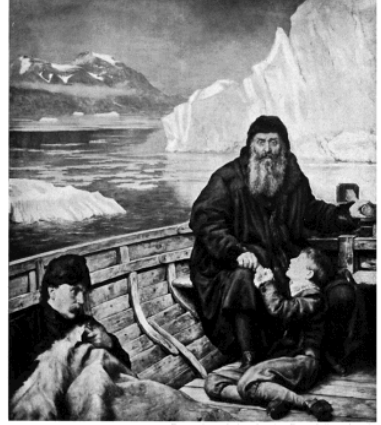


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Henry Hudson
